### DAY 01: DEPART TORONTO

Today you will make your own way over to your gateway airport to board your overnight flight to Dublin, the capital city of Ireland. Enjoy inflight services.

### DAY 02: DUBLIN ARRIVAL

(-/-/D)

Welcome to Dublin! Upon arrival at the Dublin International Airport, you will meet our representative and will be transferred to the hotel for check-in. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

### DAY 03: DUBLIN - BLARNEY CASTLE - KERRY (Approx 4hrs drive) (B/-/-)

Today after breakfast, get ready to meet your English-speaking driver and tour guide today. You will begin your day by departing the Irish capital and heading towards County Kerry. There will be an en-route stop in Blarney, home to the famous **Blarney Castle**. Dating back to 1446, the castle is a fascinating tower house built on solid limestone, which is surrounded by natural wonders. At the top of the tower, you will see the legendary Stone of Eloquence; kiss it and you will never again be lost for words. Spend some leisure time shopping at the Woollen Mills. At the time, the presence of the Woollen Mills shielded Blarney from the worst effects of the famine thanks to its wide employment of local workers. In 1976, a mill worker named Chris Kelleher bought the old mill property. Within a short time, Chris and his family transformed the mill into what is arguably the largest quality craft shop in Ireland. Continue through the southwest of Ireland towards Killarney in County Kerry.

### DAY 04: RING OF KERRY

(B/-/-)

After breakfast, you will start your day with a tour of the **Iveragh Peninsula**, where you can explore the Ring of Kerry. Take in the breathtaking scenery of the mountains, peat, bogs, lakes, and the Atlantic Ocean. Departing from Killarney, you will pass through Killorglin, famous for its Puck Fair. Travel to **Glenbeigh** (where the road offers panoramic views of the Dingle Peninsula and Dingle Bay), the sea town of Waterville, and **Sneem Village**, famous for its brightly colored houses. Stop at a local farm for a **sheepdog demonstration** along the Ring of Kerry. You will receive an overview of the different breeds of sheep, followed by an introduction to the farmer's most important tool – his border collies. Next, you will see a superb demonstration of shepherding as the farmer demonstrates how, by working together with his dogs, he can guide a flock of sheep from the mountaintop to the sheep pen close to the farmyard.

### Optional: Jaunting Car Ride in Killarney National Park (min 2 pax) CAD 40 per person

Experience transportation of a different kind! A pony and trap (also known as a Jaunting Car) will help you explore areas of Killarney National Park that you may not get the chance to visit otherwise. Relax onboard a jaunting car as your Jarvey [driver] guides you through the magnificent scenery of this breathtaking national park.



### DAY 05: KILLARNEY - CLIFFS OF MOHER - GALWAY (Approx 03hrs drive)

(B/-/-)

Today after breakfast, you will travel north towards **Tarbert** for a short boat ride across the mouth of the Shannon River. You will land on Clare's Shore in Killimer. From there you will travel along the coast to the **Cliffs of Moher**, the most majestic cliffs Ireland has to offer. These cliffs rise from the Atlantic Ocean and extend for over 7 kilometers. On a clear day, you can admire the Aran Islands and bask in the beauty of the Connemara Mountains. The cliffs reach their highest point just north of O'Brien's Tower, built by descendants of Brian Boru to entertain his lady friends. The Atlantic Edge is the exciting new interpretive centre built into the natural landscape of the cliffs. Head on a scenic tour of **The Burren**, a strange and unique region home to high plateaus of porous limestone in Northern Clare. The limestone is bare with no trees growing here or any land covering the stone. However, the Burren is not as deserted as we believe: the cracks allow different types of flowers to grow there all year round. The rocks hide many caves like Ailwee and Turloughs, an interesting phenomenon that transforms lakes into fields during the summer season. From there you will continue your journey to Galway, one of the oldest cities in Ireland.

### DAY 06: GALWAY - CONNEMARA - GALWAY

(B/-/-)

In the morning after breakfast, today you will travel through the beautiful Connemara Region, a land of lakes, rivers, bogs, and mountains where Gaelic remains the spoken language. The Connemara is a vast peninsula bordered by the arid and rocky coastline of Galway Bay in the south. On its northern shore, the land is harsher, offering spectacular views of the ocean, the fjord of the Killary Harbour, and steep mountains overlooking several lakes. The region also offers large bog areas – no wonder this is considered a haven for nature lovers! You will visit the historic **Kylemore Abbey** built by Mitchell Henry in 1868 and see its most famous feature – the miniature Cathedral. It has been home to the Irish order of Benedictine nuns since 1920. Next, you will visit **Dan O'Hara's homestead**. The Centre offers a unique insight into the history and heritage of this most beautiful part of Connemara and the West of Ireland. Here you will enjoy tea and scones.

#### DAY 07: GALWAY – DONEGAL (Approx 3hrs drive)

Begin your day with the visit to **Galway cathedral**, one of the largest and most impressive buildings built between 1958 and 1965 in Galway. Later check out and head out towards Donegal, the first stop will be **Marble Arch Caves**, explore a fascinating, natural underworld of rivers, winding passages and lofty chambers. The caves, in the heart of the UNESCO Global Geopark, were formed in limestone rock when water flowing through the rock slowly dissolved it to leave chambers, passages and systems, that you will explore during the guided tour. Then, you will continue to Donegal to arrive and check in at the hotel.

#### DAY 08: DONEGAL - GIANTS CAUSEWAY - BELFAST (Approx 4hrs drive)

(B/-/-)

Drive to Belfast, driving along the spectacular North Antrim Coastline, where you will experience the highlight of any trip to Northern Ireland: **The Giant's Causeway**, where about 40,000 interlocking basalt columns result from a volcanic eruption. The site was declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1986. Continue further to Belfast, arrive and check in at the hotel for overnight.

#### DAY 09: BELFAST - DUBLIN

(B/-/-)

This morning visit **Titanic Belfast**. Located in the heart of Belfast, the Titanic Belfast recreates the story of the world's most famous ship in an iconic, six floor building right beside the historic site of the original ship's construction. Opened in April 2012 to coincide with the centenary of its launch, the self-guided journey begins on entering the building's giant atrium, where the visitor is surrounded by the four 'ship's hull' shaped wings which house the Titanic Experience. As you journey through the nine large

galleries of the interactive exhibition, you will uncover the true story of the Titanic, from her conception in Belfast in the early 1900's, through her construction and launch, to her famous maiden voyage and subsequent place in history. Later drive to Dublin, arrive and check in at the hotel. Afternoon enjoy a half day guided tour of the city, you will first explore the north which offers striking monuments such as the **GPO** (General Post Office) on O'Connell Street and Phoenix Park, the largest public park in Europe. The city's south appears to be more sophisticated with its vast **Georgian squares and Trinity College, Dublin Castle, and two Anglican Cathedrals**. Visit the **Irish Emigration Museum**: a state-of-the-art interactive experience located in the beautiful vaults of the 1820 Custom House Quarter building in Dublin's Docklands. This was the original departure point for so many of Ireland's emigrants. It will inspire and guide you to uncover the stories of Irish emigration around the world, from the early times to the modern day.

#### DAY 10: DUBLIN

(B/-/-)

Spend the day at leisure, explore the city at your own pace, you can go for a leisurely walk through the local market, catch on your last-minute shopping or just sit and relax enjoying hotel facilities. You can also book the optional excursion to Guinness storehouse.

#### Optional: Visit to Guinness Storehouse (min 2 pax) CAD 50 per person

After brief rest visit the famous **Guinness Storehouse**. The Guinness Brewery in Dublin is Europe's largest stout producing brewery and home to the Guinness Storehouse. Opened in 1904, the Storehouse was an operational plant for fermenting and storing Guinness. Today it houses a very fine exhibition dedicated to the Guinness story. Visitors will discover what goes into the making a pint of Guinness - the ingredients, the brewing process, the time, the craft and the passion. The exhibition shows how the brew has been marketed and how it is today sold in over 150 countries. Once the tour has finished, the guest is invited to the Gravity Bar to enjoy their pint of Guinness. Regular demonstrations on the art of pulling a pint of Guinness also take place in the Storehouse.

#### DAY 11: DUBLIN DEPARTURE - TORONTO

(B/-/-)

After breakfast, day at leisure. Check out from the hotel at noon. Later you will be transferred back to the Dublin International Airport to check in for your onward flight home.

### DAY 11: DUBLIN - CARDIFF (Flight)

Fly to Cardiff, the capital of Wales is a dynamic city that blends rich history, vibrant culture, and modern waterfront charm. Arrive and transfer to the hotel.

### DAY 12: CARDIFF - BRECON BEACONS - HAY ON WYE (Approx 2hrs drive)

Begin your day with a half day guided tour of Cardiff, visit **Cardiff Castle**, located within beautiful parklands at the heart of the capital. At once a Roman fort, Norman stronghold and Victorian Gothic masterpiece, Cardiff Castle's walls and fairy-tale towers conceal 2,000 years of history. Pass by the iconic ruins of Tintern Abbey on your way towards **Cardiff Bay**; formerly the city docklands and once the largest coal-trading port in the world. Now regenerated, it is home to the Welsh parliament, the Millenium Centre, an international sports village and the BBC's home of Doctor Who. Later travel north to **Big Pit National Coal Museum**. 'Big Pit' is a celebration of the coal industry in South Wales and one of the leading mining museums in Britain. There's a lot to see and do here, and we'll have ample time to take-in the exhibitions, which tell the history of Wales' industrial past. There will also be the option to take an underground tour into one of the actual mines. Next, absorb the beautiful scenery as we journey across Brecon Beacons National Park, with the Black mountains to the east, as we make our way to the traditional market town of Brecon. Continue your journey to Hay on Wye, the town of books. Arrive and check in at the hotel.

### DAY 13: SNOWDONIA NATIONAL PARK

Begin your day discovering the quirky book stops and the magnificent Hay castle. Later travel to **Snowdonia National Park**; home to some of the most stunning scenery in Britain. This morning travel to north through the Welsh countryside and it won't be long before you cross into Snowdonia itself. Covering 823 square miles, this is Wales' largest National Park, home to mountains, valleys and charming villages. It is an area that provides the sights and sounds of 'real' Wales; more than half of the local population in this region speak Welsh. Spend the day travelling through the heart of the Snowdonia, with a number of photo-stops along the way, including the short journey to the coast, where you will take in Harlech Castle. This is one part of King Edward I's ring of magnificent 13th century medieval fortresses around North Wales. Here you will have time to visit the castle and have some lunch. Late-afternoon continue to Aberystwyth with time to explore the seaside town; take a stroll along the sea-front and the Victorian promenade.
