## Cambridge Chamber mandated vaccination policy approved

CAMBRIDGE, Ont. - The Cambridge Chamber of Commerce has taken a successful step helping to ensure businesses are able to maintain a healthy work environment for their employees.

The Chamber presented a policy at the Ontario Chamber of Commerce's recent Annual General Meeting and Convention in Brampton calling for provisions to be included in the *Occupational Health and Safety Act* to ensure business wishing to implement a mandated vaccination policy are protected from discriminatory lawsuits.

"It's important, especially now as we continue to battle the effects of COVID-19, that businesses are protected legally should they wish to take steps to ensure they have healthy workplaces and employees," says Cambridge Chamber of Commerce President and CEO Greg Durocher.

The policy received the support of most Chamber delegates who attended the AGM, and now becomes part of the Ontario Chamber policy playbook in its advocacy efforts with the Provincial Government.
